# **I: Proposed Recommendation**

Establish guidelines for registering and record keeping of graduation regalia accessories for student clubs, organizations and student support programs.

# b. Describe current policy/ protocol/ challenge:

Graduation regalia includes caps, gowns and tassels, plus special regalia that denote traditions of academic achievement (only those who have achieved an academic honor or are members of an academic honors society are entitled to wear the special regalia). There is no cost to students for the graduation regalia including caps, gowns, black tassels with a charm denoting the year, and academic honors tassels (red, silver or gold), these are provided by the college.

In regards to graduation regalia *accessories* including stoles, chords, or medals, there is currently no process in place for college clubs, organizations and or student support programs to register their intent to distribute these additional items to graduates.

#### Current stoles and cords in use:

- Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society PTK members may purchase tassels, stoles and/or cords through organization.
- National Society for Leadership and Success NSLS members may purchase tassel charms, stoles, cords or medals through organization.
- **TRIO** distribute stoles to graduates who participated in TRIO student support services.
- **Veteran Student Services** distribute Red, White and Blue Cords to active military and veteran students.



#### Proposed for Commencement 2024:

- Student Government & Student Ambassadors Stoles to be distributed to student leaders who participated in these organizations during the current year.
- **MILE & Lead** Stoles to be distributed to those who participated in these support services.
- Veteran's Club Camo Stoles to be distributed by Veteran & Military Services Office to club members only.

## c. Describe recommended policy/protocol change, and the benefit/impact:

STCC graduates are welcome to wear cords, stoles, and medals representing their achievements and membership in STCC recognized clubs, organizations and student support programs. Students will be encouraged to check with their respective clubs, organizations and/or student support programs to determine if graduation regalia accessories are available. Students will be responsible if any fees are associated with these items if they are not sponsored/provided by the club, organization and/or student support program.

It is recommended that STCC sponsored clubs, organizations and support programs who plan to provide stoles, cords or medals to graduates register them with the Office of Student Activities & Development through a Google form. This form will be provided to college staff who inquire about the guidelines. Students will not have access to this form.
