## MLA 9<sup>th</sup> Edition

*MLA Handbook 9<sup>th</sup> Edition* makes it easier to cite both online and print sources with two major changes:

- The 9 core elements
- The container system

**The core elements** can be applied to any resource and are listed in the following:

- 1 Author.
- 2 Title of source.
- 3 Title of container,
- 4 Other contributors,
- 5 Version,
- 6 Number,
- 7 Publisher,
- 8 Publication date,
- 9 Location.

Keep in mind that every citation does not have to include all of the core elements. If one does not apply to your resource then you move on to the next

**The container system** is used when a work is housed within another, whether it is a journal, book, or database. You repeat the core elements 3-9 for the container as well. The following is an example, using the MLA Practice Template:
